

Transit to the University of Ottawa

The University of Ottawa is conveniently located along the Transitway — a rapid transit corridor — next to Campus and Laurier Transitway Stations. Whether you live on campus or commute, transit service is fast, frequent and economical.



- High frequency **Transitway** routes 95, 96, 97 and 98 provide rapid transit service from across the city to downtown and connect with other routes in communities and the O-Train.
- Route **94** is your connection along Innes from south Orléans and Blackburn Hamlet.
- Route **95** is your connection from the east (St. Laurent, Blair, Orléans) and west (Lincoln Fields, Baseline, Nepean). VIA Train Station is a short five minute ride from campus.
- Route **96** is your connection from the far west (Lincoln Fields, Bayshore, Kanata, Stittsville).
- Route **97** is just 20 minutes to the airport and is your connection from the west (Lincoln Fields and Bayshore) and the south (Billings Bridge, South Keys), which is also served by routes **98** and **99**.
- Routes **20 - 99** travel along the Transitway through Campus and Laurier Stations, situated on the western edge of campus near the Rideau Canal.
- Routes **1 - 19** travel nearby on Rideau Street (except route 8 on Mackenzie King Bridge).
- Connexion 400 is your direct service to events at Scotiabank Place. From downtown, take route **403**.

Getting to Smyth Road Campus

- Catch route **16** at bus stops on Laurier, King Edward or Somerset. To return, route 16 lets you off at Laurier Station. Travel time between campuses is 20 minutes.
- Or take any route going to Hurdman Station and catch route **106**. Travel time between campuses is about 15 minutes.

Accessible Transit

More than half of OC Transpo's fleet is fully accessible, including the O-Train. So if you're able to get to a bus stop, then chances are you can ride conventional transit. For more information, contact us at 613-842-3625.

Bike & Ride, Rack & Roll or Park & Ride

You can ride your bike to a Transitway Station, then lock it up and hop on a bus for a relaxing ride downtown. Or, take your bike with you on routes 2, 85, 95, 96 and 97 which have buses equipped with bike racks. *Got a car?* Use one of our conveniently located Park & Ride lots and let us worry about the traffic.

Schedules

Black routes generally run all day, seven days a week. **Red** and **green** routes run during peak periods on weekdays only, and green routes require a premium fare.



Route timetables and schedules for all bus stops are posted on the web at octranspo.com. Schedules are also posted in all transit stations and at many bus stops. Or, call 613-560-1000 *plus* the 4-digit number on your bus stop flag. For Campus Station, call **613-560-1000 plus 3021**. Call 613-741-4390 seven days a week for information on routes, trip planning and to receive free maps and timetables.

Fares — Save with a Student Pass

Pay with cash (exact change), tickets or pass, but save the most with a discounted student pass for **full-time** students living in Ontario, age 27 or younger. The correct fare is displayed in the bus windshield.



Buy bus tickets and monthly passes on campus at the Pivik and Pharmacie Campus, at OC Transpo Sales Centres and at over 350 vendors in the city. Semester passes are available at the Tabaret Hall during registration, OC Transpo Sales Centres and at City of Ottawa Client Service Centres. Annual passes can only be purchased at OC Transpo Sales Centres. A low-cost Pass Protection Plan for lost or stolen annual passes is available at the time of purchase.

Always print your card ID number on your pass portion

Semester passes available for fall, winter and summer!

You'll need an OC Transpo photo ID (\$5.75) to go with your pass. Get your picture taken on campus at Tabaret Hall from **August 31 to September 11**. Or, go to an OC Transpo Sales Centres with a piece of photo identification, proof of age, and your registration form indicating full-time status or your tuition receipt. Photo IDs will also be sold at City Hall and at the City of Ottawa Client Service Centre in Kanata Mondays through Fridays from August 22 to September 11 (excl. September 7) and September 21 to October 2 between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.
